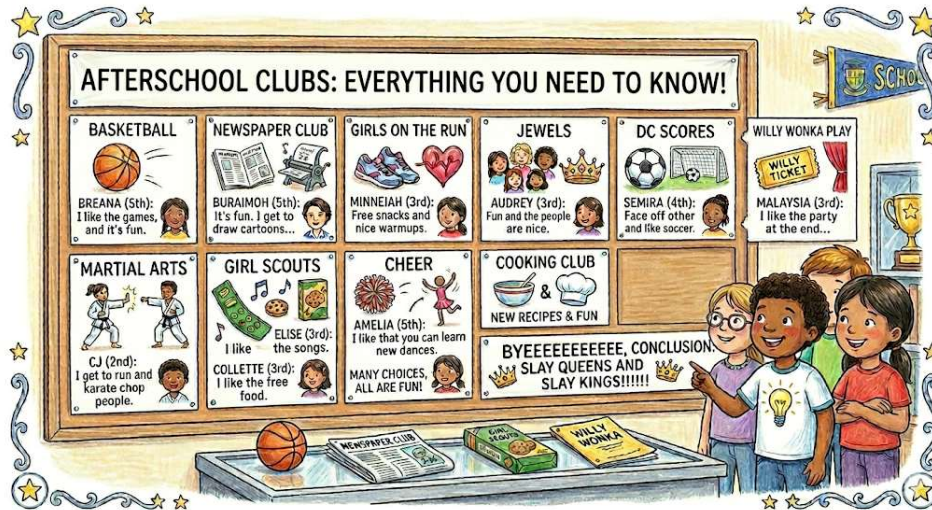

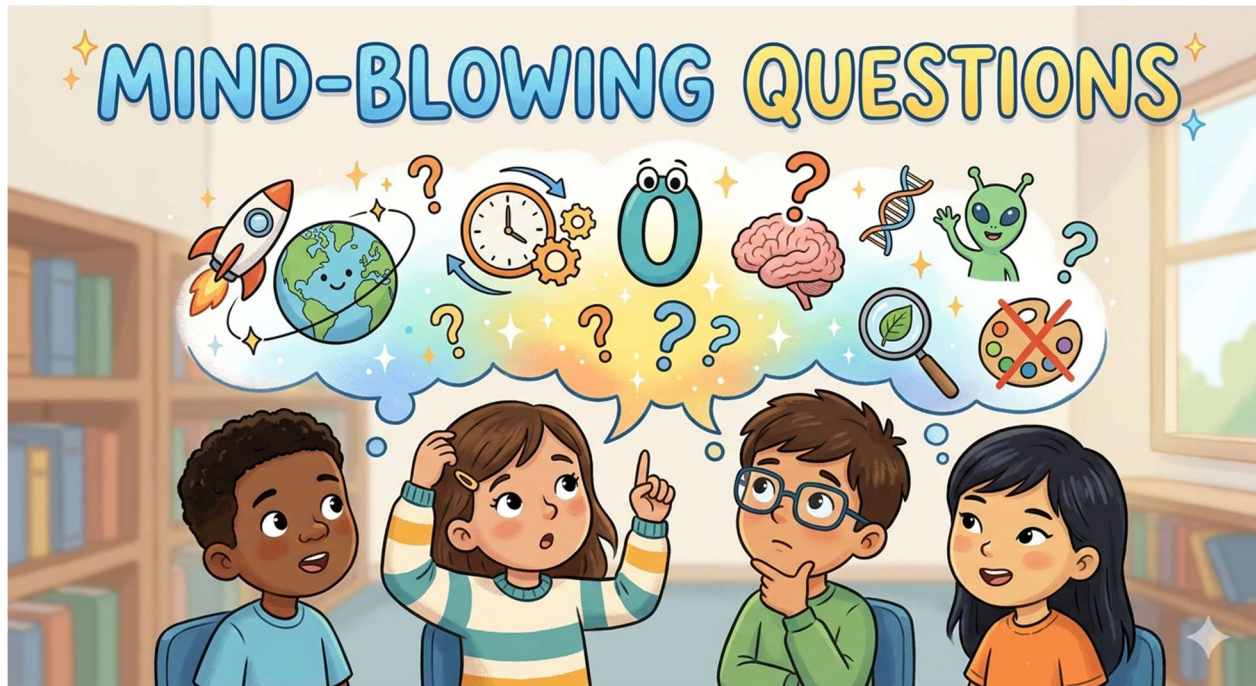
but that's cap.

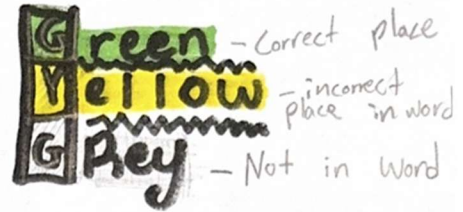
