- A fond farewell: Our wonderful STEM instructional coach Kaila Ramsey has been tapped as the new Director of Elementary Math and Science for DCPS, and transitioned to that central office role this week. We'll miss her dearly, but will cheer her on as she brings her bold vision for STEM instruction which has led to our team's and school's record growth to impact schools across DC. We've begun the hiring process for an excellent new STEM coach, and will keep you posted. - Lockdown drill: This morning we did our first of two DCPS-required lockdown drills of the school year,

 classes in advance, and students practiced hiding out of view of locked and covered doors and windows.

- No after-school Tuesday: As staff and families prepare for Thanksgiving break, there will be no after-school program this Tues, Nov 21. All students must be picked up by 3:15pm.
- Test to Return from Thanksgiving: All DCPS students and staff must negative rapid covid test to return on Monday, Nov 28. Rapid test kits will be available in the lobby until 6pm on Friday and Monday, and will be sent home in student backpacks on Monday. <u>Upload your child's result here</u> on Sunday, Nov 27 before 9pm, and bring a photo of it to arrival just in case.

REMINDERS:

- Attendance reminders from Ms. Sanchez: Attendance matters! Missing school = missing out. Did you know that missing just 2 days of school every month over the course of a school year can make it harder to learn to read? Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Please review the attached DCPS Attendance Flyer outlining the important parts of the attendance policy (which is mostly unchanged from the previous school year). A few points to highlight:
- As the holiday season begins, we ask that you **please** plan travel around the **many** dates students have off school (<u>calendar here</u>). Please also try to plan medical appointments on these off days. If this is not possible, try to plan appointments late in the afternoon or early in the morning so students can at least be present for a part of the school day.
- Please continue to notify classroom teachers AND the Attendance POC (Ms. Sanchez: <u>isabella.sanchez-pimienta2@k12.dc.gov</u>; 786-853-1305) every time a student will miss school. (PK, Ms. Castro has transitioned to another assignment in DCPS so you no longer need to copy her; we miss her and wish her well!)
- Be sure to request a medical note for any medical appointment and submit it to the Attendance POC or the office so that we can excuse those absences.
- Update: DCPS is piloting with <u>EveryDay Labs</u> to send notifications to families with updates about students' absences. **Please note that these notifications include both excused and unexcused absences.** See the attached FAQ for more information.
