Where We've Come From




Camp Barker

Freedman's Village was home from 1862-1864 to thousands of African Americans "contrabands" who had liberated themselves. The Camp Barker site is now our campus on S St NW.

Our Abolitionist Namesake & Legacy



- William Lloyd Garrison was a leading abolitionist and published *The Liberator* newspaper from 1830-1865
- Garrison Elementary School was founded in the 1880s and the current building was built in the 1960s and partially modernized in 2017



Where We Are Now: Celebrations



- Garrison is among DC's fastest growing schools
 - Ranked among **Top 5 ES (& #1 Title I!)** in **all of DC** for **past 3 years** (on '23-'25 OSSE SRCs)!
 - >60% enrollment growth over the past 8 yrs
 - 4-time **Bold Performance School** award winner from EmpowerK12, including this year!
 - Early literacy & Whole Child inspiration site
 - Among DCPS' highest staff retention (>90%)

Where We Are Now: Challenges



- We work with joyful urgency to close any “opportunity gaps” and build kindred community across difference to ensure **every** Wildcat thrives. This urgency has only increased since the pandemic and as gentrification and federal administration policies adversely impact our families.

3. Joyful, rigorous learning!




How you can help reach our vision



FAQs: Frequently-Asked Questions



- **Lottery seats:** PK seats go to in-boundary students (siblings first)
- **Class sizes:** PK3/4: 16-20 students & 2 adults; K-5: 18-25 students
- **Curriculum:** Rigorous knowledge-building units by grade
- **Meals:** Eaten in the classroom (PK) & Commons (K-5), **free** breakfast & lunch, veggie options, healthy & tasty!
- **Recess:** twice a day, ~35 (K-5) to 60 (PK) minutes total
- **Rest time (ECE):** PK3 ~90 min, PK4 ~60 min (on cots)
- **Specials (daily):** Art, Music, & Library (PK), plus twice/wk PE (K-5)
- **Before-care:** 7:00-8:15am, run by Garrison staff for monthly fee
- **After-school** 3:15-6:00; Apollo After School (PK/K/1), Garrison (2), & Kid Power (Gr 3-5), plus various partners & enrichment/clubs
